LEAF COLLECTION

Vacuum leaf collection tentatively begins the 2nd full week of October. Weather permitting, city crews will attempt to make two passes through town to collect leaves. You can either place your loose leaf piles on the berm (between curb and sidewalk) and await collection or haul them to a local yard waste site. (See last page for yard waste site locations.) Bagged leaves will not be collected.
